

Confusing verbs



Make

creation of a physical object, an action/reaction, a sound/speech or food

"My dad likes to make furniture."

Do jobs or activities, with "anything" or "something", also indicates generic action

"I need to do housework."



Refuse

to decline to accept/give; unwillingness

"I refuse to argue."



declaring untruth, disagreement, to withhold or disown something, to reject or contradict.

"Most deny that the sky is orange."



Say

a verb usually used without an object With an object + "to"

"She knew what to say to her sister."

informs or instructs



"Tell your brother to make his bed."

Sta

In most cases, these words are interchangeable.

Remain

Both words have also developed unique idiomatic uses.



"Don't stay out late."

away from home

"Though the team lost, fans remain loyal."

continue in spite of



"Most prefer to sit when they eat."
